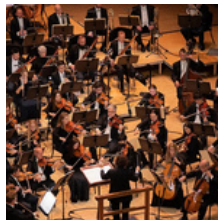


FIELD TRIPS SCHEDULE

AND THEN THEY CAME FOR ME:
Remembering the World of Anne Frank
Wednesday, March 3, 2027 | 11am
Grades 6 – 12

And Then They Came for Me is a unique theatrical experience. The multimedia play combines videotaped interviews of Holocaust survivors with live actors recreating scenes from their lives during World War II, including their memories of Anne Frank. The story is based on the book *Eva's Story* by Eva Geiringer Schloss. Part oral history, part dramatic action, part direct address, part remembrance, *And Then They Came for Me* chronicles Eva and Anne's childhood, as they knew each other from school. Interesting Facts: After World War II, Eva's mother married Anne's father, Otto Frank. Eva passed away on January 3, 2026 at the age of 96!

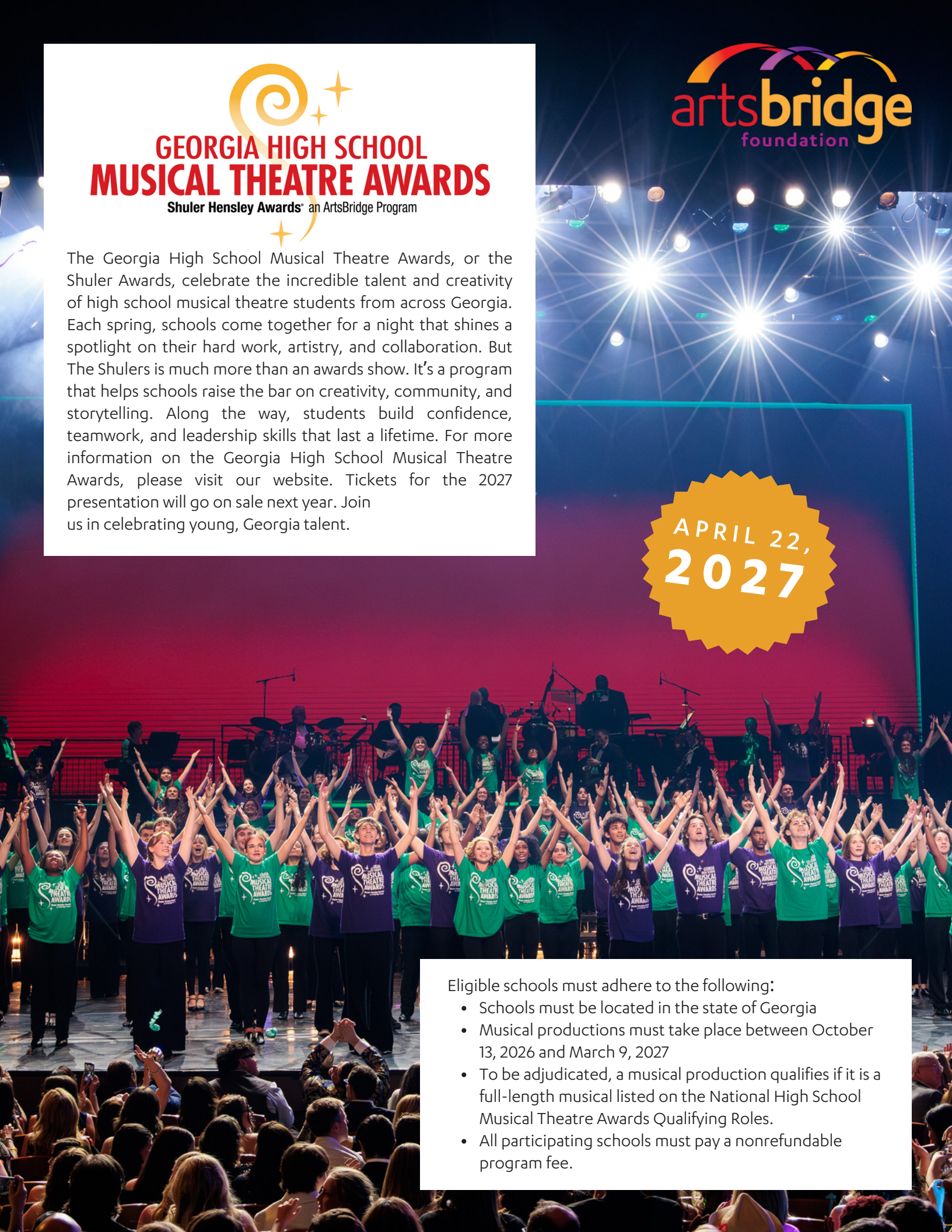
GEORGIA HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL THEATRE AWARDS

Shuler Hensley Awards® an ArtsBridge Program

The Georgia High School Musical Theatre Awards, or the Shuler Awards, celebrate the incredible talent and creativity of high school musical theatre students from across Georgia. Each spring, schools come together for a night that shines a spotlight on their hard work, artistry, and collaboration. But The Shulers is much more than an awards show. It's a program that helps schools raise the bar on creativity, community, and storytelling. Along the way, students build confidence, teamwork, and leadership skills that last a lifetime. Eligible schools must adhere to the following:

- Schools must be located in the state of Georgia
- Musical productions must take place between October 13, 2026 and March 9, 2027
- To be adjudicated, a musical production qualifies if it is a full-length musical listed on the National High School Musical Theatre Awards Qualifying Roles.
- All participating schools must pay a nonrefundable program fee.

HOW IT WORKS

From mid-October to mid March, a panel of adjudicators evaluates each production and provides scores and feedback for each eligible award category. Once all adjudications are completed, scores are tabulated by an independent auditing firm and nominations are announced during a Georgia Public Broadcasting (GPB) live broadcast in mid-March.

Participating schools have access to unique opportunities through the GHSMTA program! Each school may nominate up to two students for the Shuler Ensemble, performing the opening and closing medleys during a live broadcast of the production. In addition, up to two technical theatre students can be nominated for the S.T.A.R. Council (Students Take A Role), serving as production assistants backstage during The Shulers. Students are also eligible to apply for scholarships, which are announced during a live broadcast of the nominations.

The recipients of the Leading Actress and Actor Awards are sent to New York City to compete in the National High School Musical Theatre Awards – The Jimmy Awards®, where they have the chance to win college scholarship opportunities and the coveted National Award.

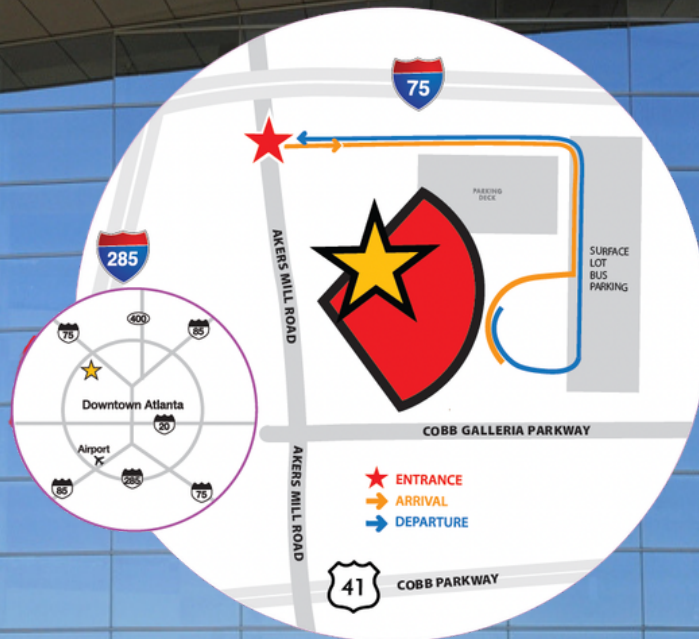

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PARKING

AFTER DROPPING THE STUDENTS OFF NEAR THE FRONT DOORS, SCHOOL BUSES WILL BE DIRECTED TO PARK IN THE FLAT LOT ACROSS FROM THE THEATRE ENTRANCE. ALL OTHER VEHICLES INCLUDING CARS, SUVs, VANS, ETC., WILL BE DIRECTED TO THE PARKING DECK ADJACENT TO THE THEATRE.

TICKETS & RESERVATIONS

- Tickets are \$10 for students and adult chaperones, or “Pay What You Can” for Title 1 and/or eligible schools.
- (1) complimentary ticket will be issues for every (15) student tickets purchased.
- Everyone must have a ticket to enter the theater.

ARRIVAL & ETIQUETTE

- Doors will open approximately (1) hour prior to performance start time.
- We *recommend* early arrival.
- Seating is based on the order of arrival and entry. Arrive before 10:15am to access the best seating options.
- Arrivals after 10:30am are at risk of delayed entry.
- Since seating is based on arrival, group seating and arrival must be coordinated prior to arriving at Cobb Energy Centre. If groups wish to be seated together, all busses must arrive together.
- All backpacks, lunch boxes, etc must remain on the bus.
- There are no lunch areas on property at Cobb Energy Centre.

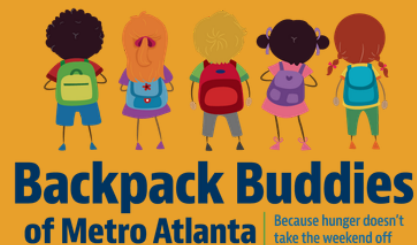


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SNACK PACKS
