## Shuler Hensley

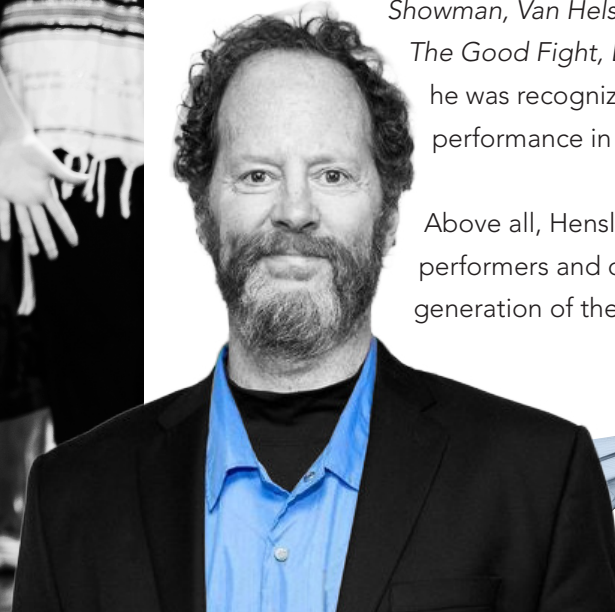

**SHULER HENSLEY** is a Tony Award–winning actor and the namesake of Georgia’s High School Musical Theatre Awards (The Shuler Awards). He currently serves as Artistic Director of City Springs Theatre Company, where he has directed productions including *Come From Away*, *The Music Man*, *Fiddler on the Roof*, and *The Sound of Music*. He recently directed a concert production of *Oklahoma!* at Carnegie Hall and appeared in *Millions* at the Alliance Theatre.

On Broadway, Hensley has appeared in *The Music Man* (with Hugh Jackman), *The Ferryman*, *Les Misérables*, *Young Frankenstein*, *Tarzan*, and *Oklahoma!*—earning Tony, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, and Olivier Awards. His extensive Off-Broadway and regional credits include *The Whale*, *Sweet Charity*, *Assassins*, and *Carousel* with the New York Philharmonic.

His work spans opera, symphony performances, film (*The Greatest Showman*, *Van Helsing*), and television (*Dexter: New Blood*, *The Good Fight*, *Law & Order*). A proud Equity member, he was recognized by New York Magazine for his performance in *The Whale*.

Above all, Hensley is passionate about mentoring young performers and continues to be inspired by the next generation of theatre artists.

## Executive Director

---

Thomas Fowlkes joined ArtsBridge as Executive Director in 2024. He brings over 20 years of non-profit arts experience to the position. Most recently he served as Executive Director of the Michael O'Neal Singers and as Managing Director of Theatrical Outfit, an award winning theatre company based in the heart of downtown Atlanta.

Previously, he was General Manager of the Atlanta Ballet, where in addition to managing all things related to the stage, he was at the helm of producing their brand-new Nutcracker in 2018, the Ballet's first new production of Nutcracker in 20 years. Prior to Atlanta Ballet, he was Managing Director at Horizon Theatre in Little Five Points. He also spent three years as a Creative Manager and Development Manager at Jamestown LP, where he played a key role in the creation of the rooftop experience at Ponce City Market. While in New York City he worked with Charles Cosler Theater Design, Bill T Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company, and Barbizon Electric.

He served as Director of Production for Lookingglass Theater Company in Chicago and was instrumental in the creation of their new facility at the Water Tower Water Works on Michigan Avenue. Mr. Fowlkes received his education at Rice University and studied nonprofit management at the Georgia Center for Nonprofits.



## Director of Arts Education

---

Elizabeth Lenhart is a lifelong educator, performer, and producer whose career bridges the U.S. and the Dominican Republic. A classically trained soprano with a background in ballet, jazz, and tap, she has appeared in productions such as *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*, *The Pirates of Penzance*, and *Once Upon a Mattress* in the U.S., and *CATS*, *Annie*, and *Hansel & Gretel* in the Dominican Republic, where she also worked as a vocal coach.

During her 30 years abroad, she served as Choral Conductor and Fine Arts Coordinator at Carol Morgan School, then directed Gymboree Play & Music as Master Franchise Owner. She later founded JAM Academy, where she produced and directed musicals including *The Wizard of Oz*, *Oliver*, *Peter Pan*, *Shrek*, *Hairspray*, and *FAME*, and launched JAM CARES, raising funds for charitable causes through concerts and benefit productions.

Since 2022, she has led ArtsBridge Foundation's education initiatives and serves as Director of the Georgia High School Musical Theatre Awards.

Under her leadership, the program has earned Southeast Regional Emmy Awards in 2022 and 2023, with another nomination in 2024.

She holds degrees from Penn State University and a Master's in Education from Framingham State University. While her greatest passion is inspiring students through the arts, her two daughters, Gabriella and Megan, remain her deepest source of pride.

## Artistic Vision: The Silent Revolution

What if two things could be true at the same time?

Tonight's performance invites you into a space where contradiction is not something to resolve, but something to explore.

We live in a world that often asks us to choose...  
connection or independence,  
truth or perspective,  
difference or belonging.

But theatre has never lived in "either/or." It lives in "Yes, and."

As you watch tonight, you may notice moments of contrast: light and shadow, stillness and sound, individuality and ensemble. These are not opposites in conflict. They are elements in conversation.

Tension on stage is not there to divide. It is what moves the story forward. It is what reveals something deeper.

This year's production embraces that idea through what we call a silent revolution, one that doesn't shout, but speaks through music, movement, and image. It asks us to listen more closely, to look more intentionally, and to consider what might be possible when we stop trying to create sameness and instead allow differences to coexist.

You may begin the evening in a world that feels uncertain, undefined, even fragmented.

As the night unfolds, you may notice something shifting. Not because the differences disappear, but because they begin to align in new ways.

This is the heart of artistic resistance.

Not louder voices, but deeper listening.

Not fewer differences, but greater understanding.

Not choosing sides, but choosing to see.

As you experience tonight's performance, we invite you to lean into the moments of contrast. Sit in the tension. Notice what emerges.

Because sometimes, the most beautiful harmony is not found in sameness, but in the courage to hold multiple truths at once.

**DeKalb School of the Arts, Memphis:** For redefining access in the rehearsal room by implementing individualized learning strategies, trauma-informed practices, and a culturally responsive approach to storytelling, ensuring that every student, regardless of learning style or background, could fully engage, grow, and excel.

**Duluth High School, West Side Story:** For elevating authentic storytelling through community and student voice by collaborating with cultural leaders and centering the lived experiences of their students, ensuring the story was told with honesty, respect, and a deeper understanding of the community it represents.

**Greenbrier High School, The Hello Girls:** For turning performance into purpose by replacing traditional ticket sales with a community toy drive for military families, transforming their production into an act of service and using theatre as a platform for generosity, empathy, and impact.

**Martha Ellen Stilwell School of the Arts, The Wiz:** For celebrating identity through transformational storytelling by infusing their production with BIPOC cultural history, Afrofuturism, and LGBTQ+ ballroom culture, while removing financial barriers through sustainable design, creating a space where every student could see themselves reflected and empowered.

**Ringgold High School, The Little Mermaid:** For building a culture of belonging through connection and care through their "SOUL" framework and "Triple H" initiative, creating a rehearsal space rooted in empathy, unity, and shared purpose, ensuring every student feels seen, valued, and essential to the story.

**Wesleyan School, Newsies:** For expanding what leadership looks like in theatre by empowering a student with disabilities to serve as stage manager through collaborative support systems and connecting their production to community service, demonstrating that theatre can develop leaders both on and off the stage.

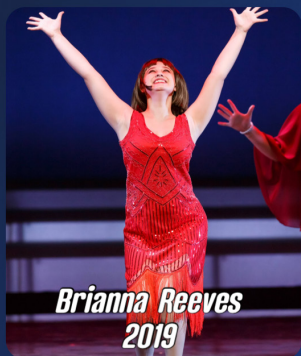
